IMPACT FROM DAY ONE: PROVISIONAL PHILANTHROPY

The 2025-2026 Provisional class of the Junior League of Fort Worth turned compassion into action through two impactful Philanthropy Projects: the Fall and Spring Mobile Diaper Distribution Events. Led by Active Member **Capriana Oyedeji**, these large-scale service projects brought together Provisional members, community partners, and volunteers in a powerful demonstration of service in motion.

Together, the Fall and Spring Mobile Diaper Distribution Events provided an astounding 192,000 diapers to local families in need. More than just a number, each diaper represented relief for parents, support for caregivers, and a reminder that the Junior League of Fort Worth continues to meet community needs through hands-on service and meaningful partnerships.

These projects also served as a meaningful introduction for Provisionals to the League’s legacy of volunteerism and community impact. Through long hours, teamwork, and shared purpose, the Provisional class experienced firsthand what it means to lead through service and strengthen the Fort Worth community one family at a time.

DELIVERING DIGNITY: JLFW DIAPER BANK

Founded in 2020, the Junior League of Fort Worth Diaper Bank has become one of the League’s most impactful community initiatives, addressing a critical yet often overlooked public health issue affecting families across Tarrant County. Guided this year by Co-Chairs **Morvarid “Mo” DeFelice** and **Amy Radcliffe**, the Diaper Bank continued its mission to eliminate diaper need and improve the physical, mental, and financial well-being of children and adults experiencing poverty, mobility challenges, or health limitations.

Through the generosity of donors, diaper drives, fundraising efforts, and wholesale purchasing, the JLFW Diaper Bank

provides diapers at no cost to local nonprofit partners serving vulnerable populations throughout the community. In partnership with the Tarrant Area Food Bank, the Diaper Bank stores and distributes inventory monthly to agencies working on the front lines of community care.

During the 2025-2026 League year alone, the JLFW Diaper Bank distributed over 1.4 million diapers, helping families maintain dignity, stability, and access to essential care. Since its inception, the program has distributed more than 4 million diapers to nearly 100 nonprofit agencies throughout Tarrant County, creating a far-reaching impact for thousands of individuals and families.
