BUILDING A LEGACY: PROVISIONAL CLASS

A YEAR OF PURPOSE, SERVICE, AND CONNECTION

The 2024–2025 Provisional Class represents the future of the Junior League of Fort Worth—140 dynamic women who have embraced leadership, service, and sisterhood. From day one, this class hit the ground running, sampling every part of League life—from Rodeo to Community placements, Junior MINTS, and DIADs. With 356 training sessions completed and nearly 4,000 MINTS service hours logged, this group has already made a lasting mark.

This was the year of revival of the Provisional Community Bus Tour. Inspired by our history and led by enthusiastic bus hosts, Provisionals traveled across Fort Worth to visit partner agencies like Casa Mañana, Justin's Place, and The Women's Center. These first-hand experiences deepened their understanding of JLFW's community impact—and made room for a few magic moments.

Provisionals gave back in meaningful ways: distributing diapers and wipes during their Provisional Philanthropy Project and serving FWISD students through Junior MINTS and Paint-a-Playground. They've seen the Mission in action and stepped up to be part of it.

With their hearts full and boots on the ground, these Gold Star Volunteers have built bonds and found joy in service. As they move into Active membership, we can't wait to watch them lead, grow, and shape the future of JLFW.

We also celebrated the nomination and election of 11 Board positions, continuing a proud tradition of member-led governance and strategic vision.

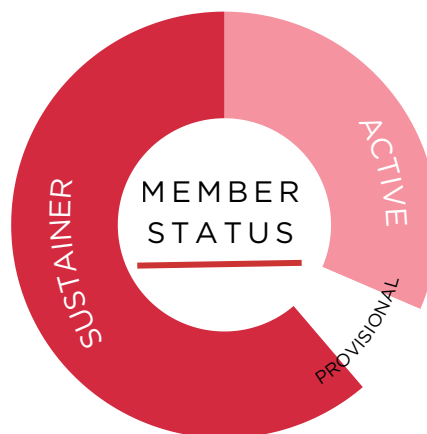

POWERING THE MISSION: FUNDRAISING IN ACTION

EVERY DOLLAR RAISED HELPS JLFW LEAD WITH PURPOSE AND CREATE LASTING IMPACT

This year's *Christmas in Cowtown Holiday Gift Market (CIC)* brought festive flair and fundraising power to Will Rogers Memorial Center, raising over \$1 million for JLFW's mission. Under the leadership of Co-Chairs **Kelly Ray** and **Erica Pifer**, the 2024 *Market* embraced a Merry & Bright theme inspired by traditional holiday motifs with a modern twist—scalloped edges, pastel hues, and timeless charm.

With nearly 100 committee members, 500+ volunteers, and two former *CIC* Co-Chairs as sustaining advisors, this year's *Market* was a standout success. From Preview Party to final sale, *CIC 2024* proved that when women lead with creativity and purpose, the impact is lasting—and joyful.



The 2025 *Grand Entry Gala (GEG)* set the stage for rodeo season with a night of celebration and generosity. Guests enjoyed a gourmet dinner by Reata, danced to Randy Rogers Band, and helped raise \$265,000 in support of JLFW's mission.

Co-Chairs **Caroline Padron** and **Sarah Shaw**, with Honorary Chairs Molly and Rusty Reid, hosted the sold-out evening at Will Rogers Memorial Center.

Now in its 13th year, *GEG* continues to honor Fort Worth tradition while powering our shared vision for a stronger community.

Since 1957, JLFW has proudly partnered with the Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo to sell the official Rodeo Souvenir Annual through our **Rodeo Program Sales**. In 2025, this cherished tradition continued under the leadership of Co-Chairs **Margaret Harper** and **Casey Kirchner**, as Members donned their signature red aprons and volunteered over 2,000 hours to promote and sell programs throughout Dickies Arena.

Each program sold contributed \$2 to support initiatives in arts and culture, education, health, and basic human needs. This year's efforts raised an impressive \$107,000, benefiting partners such as Academy 4, Community Healthcare of Texas, the Fort Worth Zoo, Presbyterian Night Shelter, Unbound Now, Laundry Love Fort Worth, and The Women's Center.

Thanks to the Rodeo Program Sales Committee and every member who gave their time, this initiative continues to showcase the spirit of service that defines JLFW—and transforms every "Rodeo program!" into real community impact.



The Annual Fund provides essential operating support for the Junior League of Fort Worth, helping sustain everything from Member training to day-to-day operations. In 2025, under the leadership of Co-Chairs **Julia Davis** and **Mary Mitchell Young**, the Annual Fund raised \$37,000 to support JLFW's mission.

Members showed their support throughout the year with purchases of spirited merchandise, as well as donations to North Texas Giving Day on our Find the Good Day. The return of the Love Our League campaign encouraged giving, reminding us that every gift—no matter the size—makes a difference.

Thanks to all who gave, and our community partner of North Texas Community Foundation, the Annual Fund helped ensure more resources could be directed to the community we serve, keeping our Mission strong all year long.





LEADING WITH IMPACT: JLFW IN THE COMMUNITY

HANDS-ON SERVICE, MEANINGFUL PARTNERSHIPS, AND REAL RESULTS ACROSS FORT WORTH

Continuing our long-standing commitment to serving the community through action, JLFW Members gave thousands of volunteer hours. Each shift served strengthened local agencies and supported families across Tarrant County, creating meaningful impact.

Day of Giving

In just two days, once in November, once in April, 325 Members volunteered 980 hours across 40 agencies. Projects ranged from painting and sorting donations to student engagement and facility support. North Texas Community Foundation generously supported our efforts and helped unify our appearance through branded shirts.

Done In A Day

JLFW responded to short-term needs through 100+ shifts across nearly 40 agencies, logging 1,370 hours of service in flexible, high-impact ways.

Paint a Playground

At Seminary Hills Elementary, Provisionals painted colorful games like hopscotch and four-square and provided new equipment to promote daily active play. Other schools served included Carter Parkside and Waverly Park.

Diaper Bank

A signature initiative since 2020, the JLFW Diaper Bank distributed close to 1.25 million diapers and 900,000 wipes this year—bringing the total to over 2 million diapers given to Fort Worth families in need. JLFW Provisionals also led two Mobile Diaper Distributions, delivering nearly 200,000 diapers to over 4,000 children at four Fort Worth locations.

Junior MINTS

Serving nine campuses, 156 Provisionals contributed 4,400+ hours mentoring students, supporting teachers, and facilitating family engagement events.

Little Leaguers

JLFW's youngest volunteered with agencies like Tarrant Area Food Bank, The WARM Place, and Wings of Hope, preparing care kits, cleaning, sorting, and learning the value of community service together.

COMMUNITY

SHAPING LEADERS THROUGH IMMERSIVE TRAINING

JLFW EMPOWERS WOMEN TO LEAD—IN THE LEAGUE, ACROSS FORT WORTH, AND BEYOND.

At the Junior League of Fort Worth, leadership is cultivated through learning, mentorship, and hands-on experience. This year, JLFW deepened its investment in member development through elevated training programs, strengthened DEIB work, and our All aBoard cohort.

All aBoard

In its 10th year, All aBoard launched a redesigned curriculum rooted in strategic, personal, and community leadership. Chaired by **Magellan Taylor-Brickey**, the 21-member cohort engaged in training topics like emotional intelligence, strategic decision-making, and innovative thinking—paired with nonprofit governance sessions led by BoardBuild. Participants reflected on their CliftonStrengths, attended Mentor Mixers with Sustainers, and took part in the League's first Community Leadership Fair, connecting them directly with agencies seeking board members. By graduation, every Member left equipped to serve with confidence and clarity.

Training

JLFW's Training Committee, led by **Ali Moses** and **Eva Williams**, planned 40 sessions serving 639 members and totaling 1,450 training hours. Topics ranged from financial literacy and wellness to nonprofit strategy and DEIB. For the first time, JLFW joined the Training Collaborative of Junior Leagues, expanding access to global content from peer Leagues. Partners included the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth, Leadership Fort Worth, and Texas Health Resources, helping deliver dynamic, community-informed workshops.

DEIB

The Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Belonging Committee (chaired by **Tishara Jackson (TJ) Shaw** and **Lindsay Tooker**) aligned its work with JLFW's strategic plan—embedding inclusive practices across League life. Highlights included 12+ trainings, panel discussions on maternal mental health and interfaith perspectives, and collaborations with Provisionals, Little Leaguers, and Member Monthly that brought belonging into every touchpoint.
